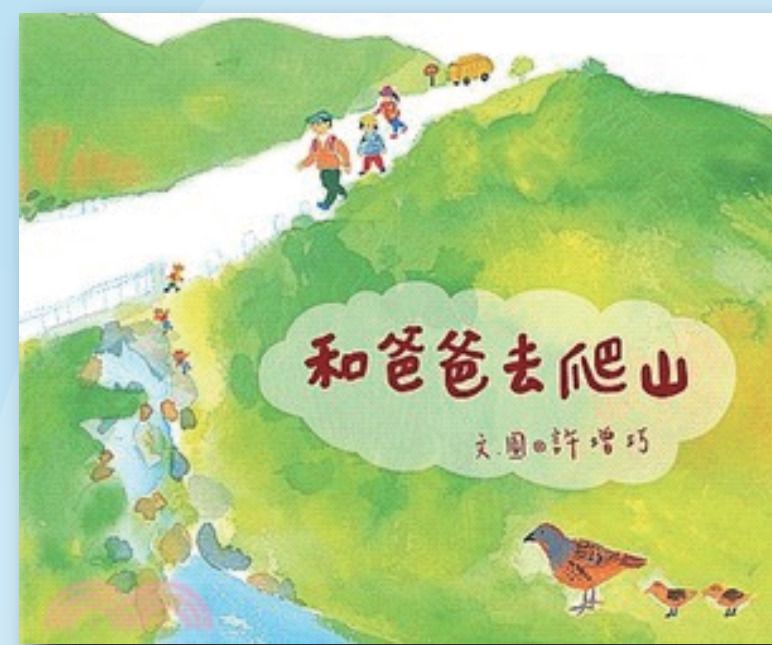


Outdoors 我最愛去的地方！

明瑪沒有因此而灰心喪志，他反而更勇敢樂觀去面對人生，珍惜這份得來不易的自由及學習機會。

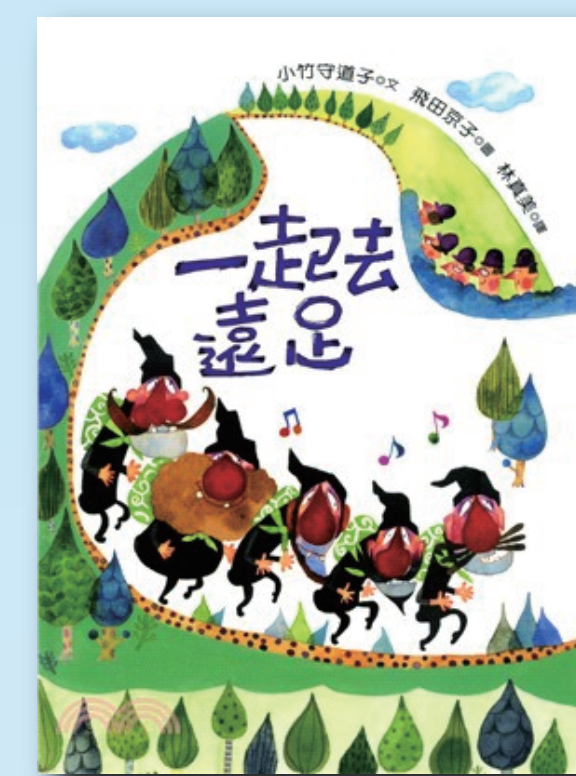


跑跑鎮

免不了會撞在一起……



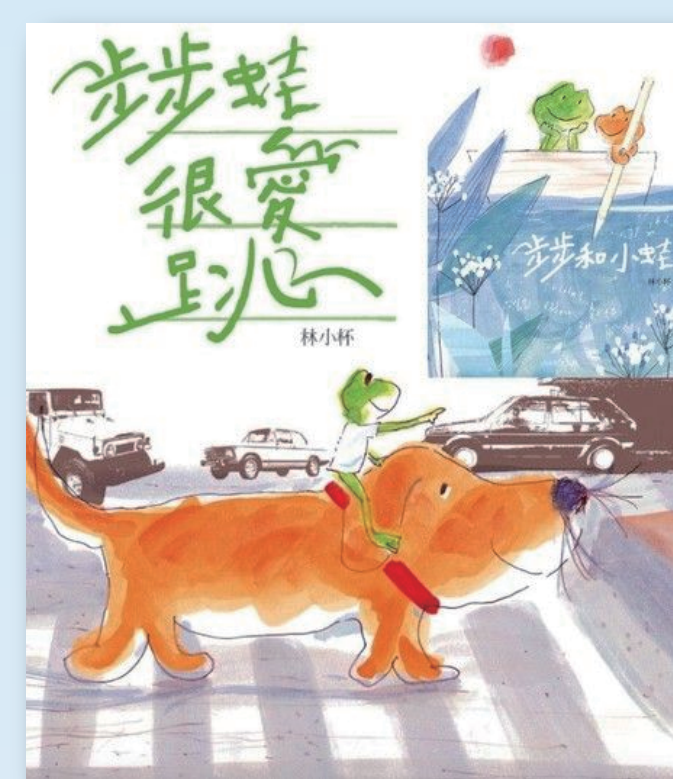
一起去遠足

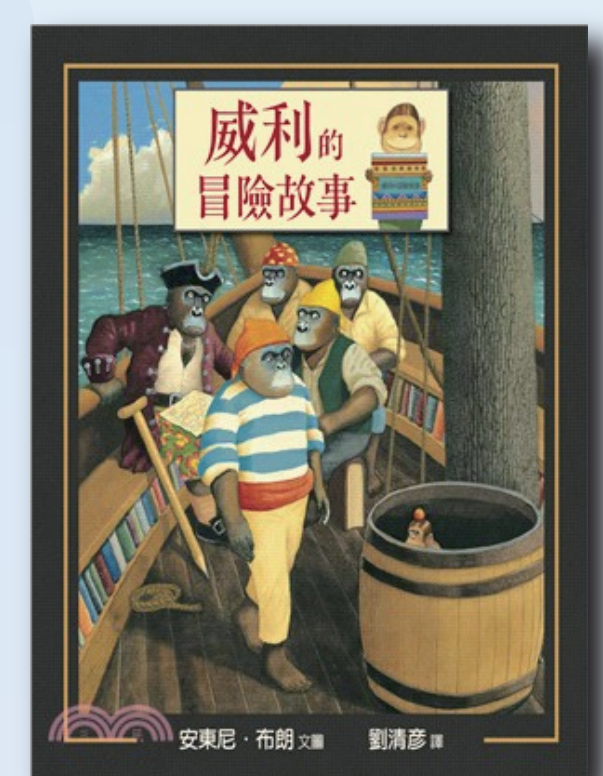


一起來騎腳踏車

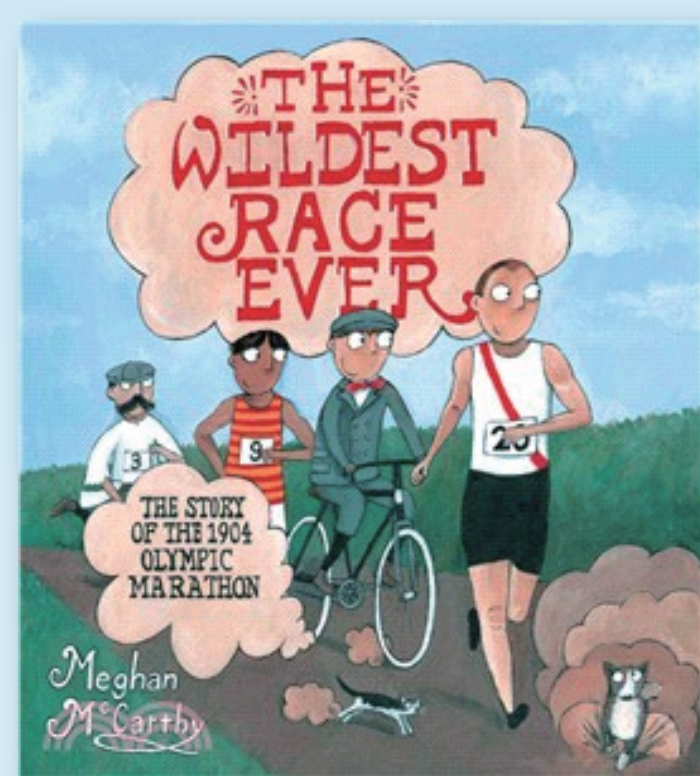
I Will Try

A young girl beginning to learn gymnastics is tempted to quit because she cannot spin and jump like her friend Jan, but Jan persuades her to keep trying.



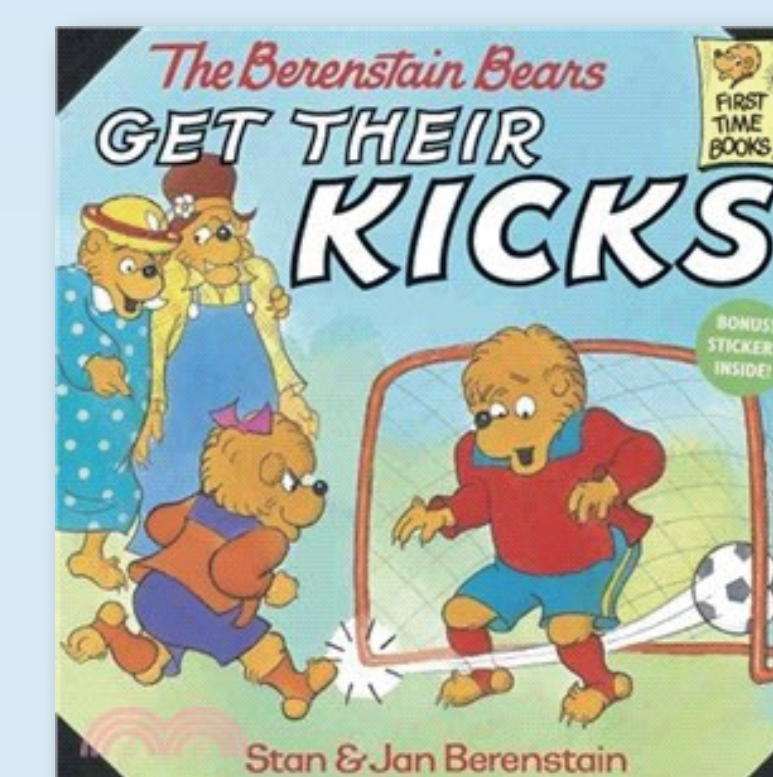
America's Champion Swimmer: Gertrude Ederle

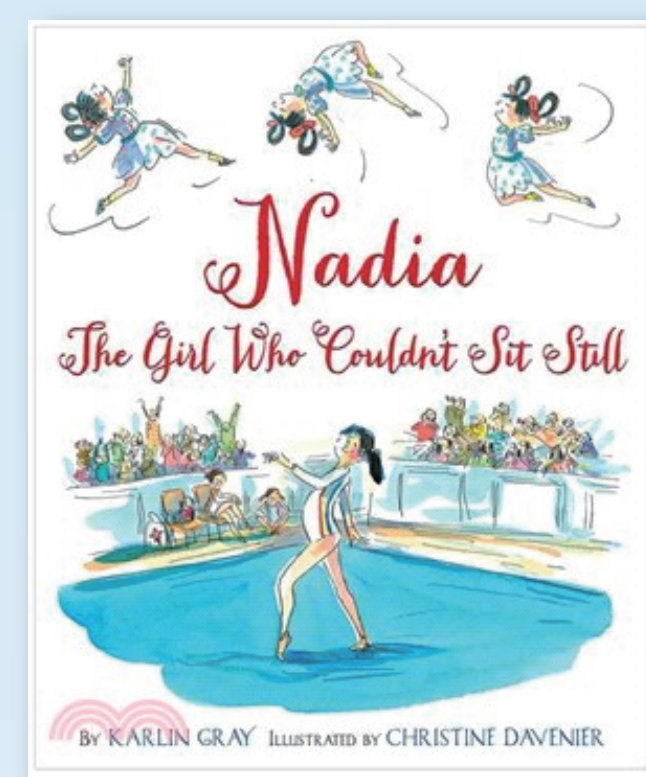

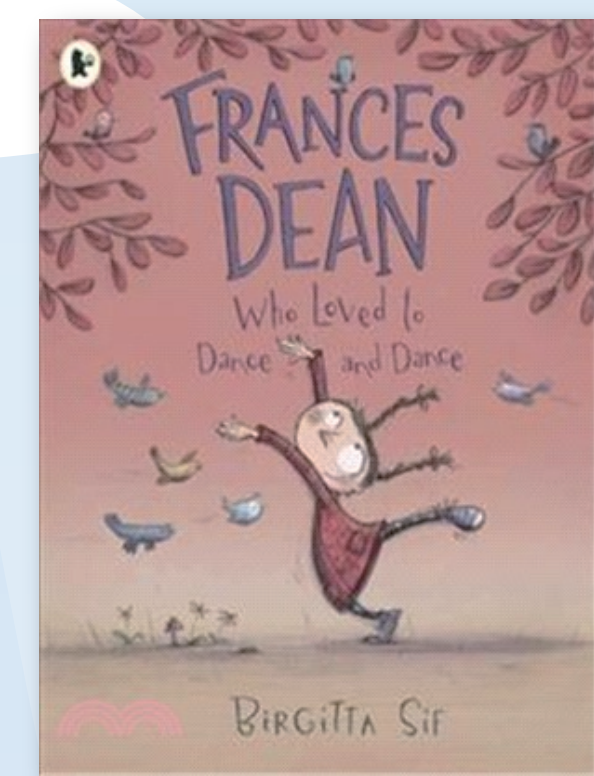
The Berenstain Bears Get Their Kicks

When Brother and Sister try out for soccer teams, Papa is at first disappointed that they do not want to play baseball, but he changes his mind when he sees them practice.



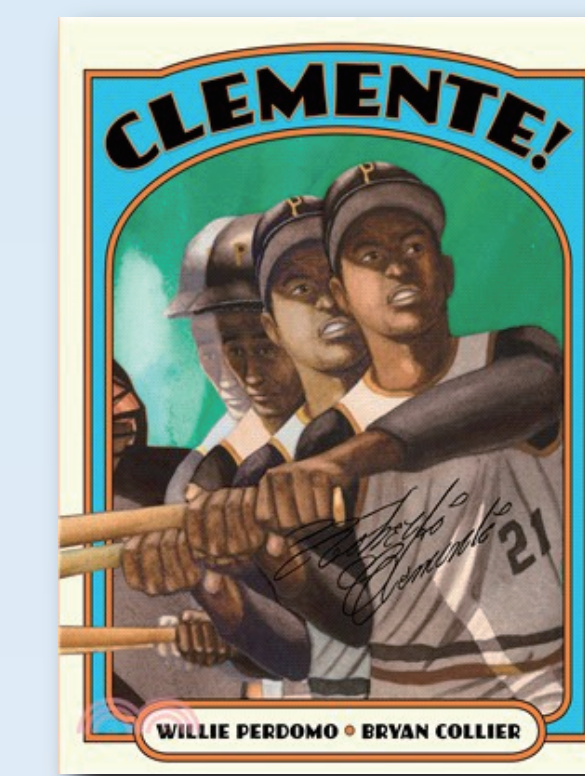
Nadia — The Girl Who Couldn't Sit Still

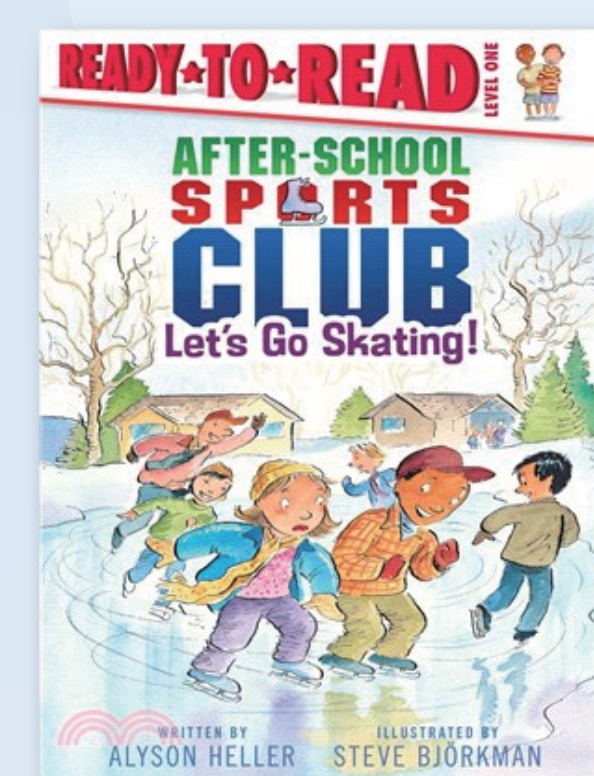
Frances Dean Who Loved to Dance and Dance

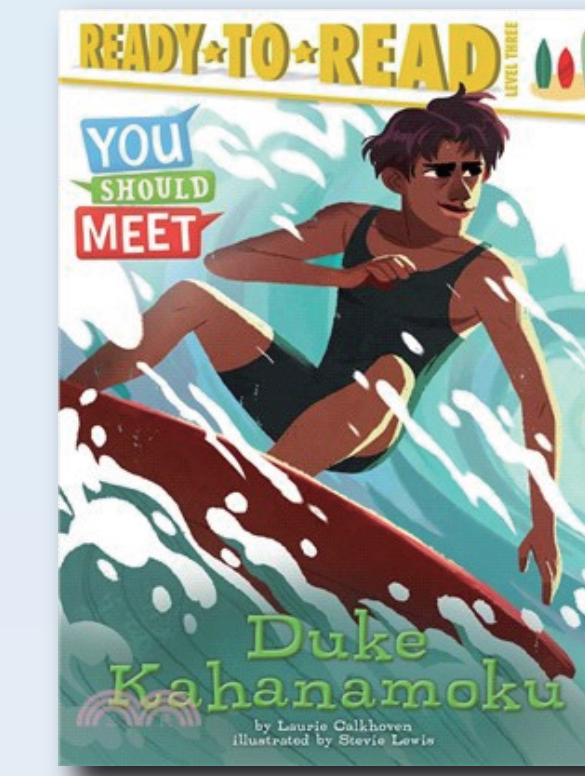
Clemente!

Born in Puerto Rico, Roberto Clemente was the first Latin American player to be inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame, and the only player for whom the five-year initiation period was waived. Known not only for his exceptional baseball skills but also for his extensive charity work in Latin America, Clemente was well-loved during his 18 years playing for the Pittsburgh Pirates. He died in a plane crash while bringing aid supplies to earthquake victims in Nicaragua.



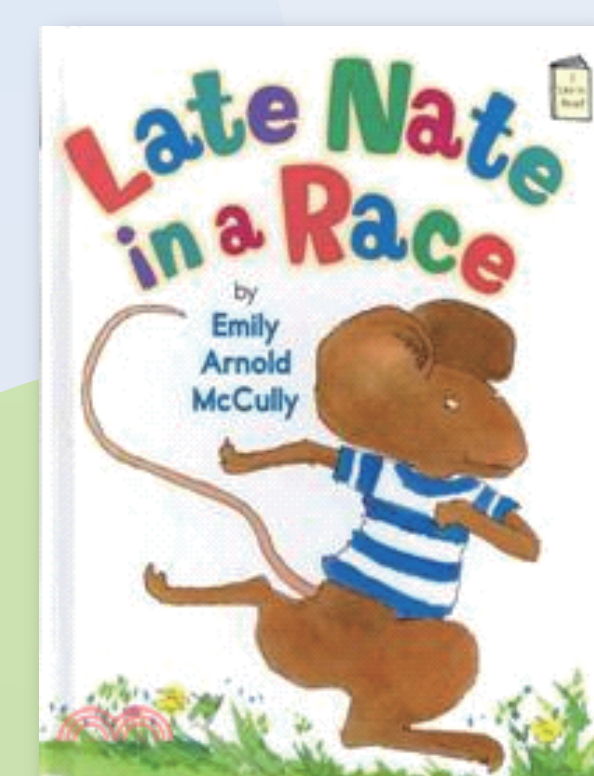
Let's Go Skating!
